Proving Trials on Wearable Cameras to Begin in April at Haneda's International Terminal

In April, SECOM CO., LTD. and Tokyo International Air Terminal Corporation (TIAT) will commence proving trials on a wearable camera for use by security personnel in the international passenger terminal of Haneda Airport.

With the growing threat of terrorism around the world and the progress of globalization with the government's initiative to establish Japan as a tourism nation, airports are called upon more than ever before to provide advanced security with greater mobility to prevent terrorist incidents and accidents.

The trials will test the efficacy of wearable cameras in security work and contribute to improving the safety Haneda Airport International Terminal.

The cameras used will be worn on the chest by patrolling security officers enabling the following:

- (1) Should a problem occur during patrols, images transmitted in real-time from the wearable cameras will be displayed on a monitor at security headquarters so that the situation can be verified immediately and instructions provided for swift initial response.
- (2) Using positioning and communications technologies, security headquarters will be able to determine the locations of the security officers wearing cameras in real-time so that emergency measures can be implemented speedily at the location of the incident or accident.

Eight wearable cameras will be used for the proving trials in April, and full-scale introduction will be planned based on the results. A high level of safety is a key foundation of our society. TIAT will continue with its efforts to meet various security needs through technical and service improvements.
